This is a recipe I've made many times for company. The cost of meat nowadays is outrageously high, along with everything else. Pork loin may be a more economical alternative for your family Christmas dinner.

Stuffed Pork Loin with Raspberry Sauce

Preheat your oven to 400 degrees.

Pork loin (you can choose whatever size is best for your family).

To prepare your pork loin for stuffing, place on your preferred work surface for raw meat. Slice the loin lengthwise, being careful not to cut all the way through. Open the loin and pound with a meat mallet to about 1/2" thick. Pat dry with paper towel and season with salt and pepper.

Stuffing:

This is a simple bread stuffing*:

- 1 Tbs olive oil
- 1/4 c finely chopped onion
- 2 cloves garlic minced

1 tsp fresh rosemary minced

¹/₂ c panko breadcrumbs

Add 1 tablespoon of olive oil to an oven-safe skillet and add the diced onion. Cook for 2-3 minutes. Add the minced garlic, rosemary, and breadcrumbs to the pan and combine well.

Spread this mixture over the prepared pork loin, roll into a log and tie with kitchen twine. Salt and pepper the rolled loin.

Add the remaining tablespoon of olive oil to the skillet, heat, then sear the loin 2 minutes per side. Add **2 tablespoons butter, a couple of springs of fresh rosemary and 3 whole garlic cloves.** Place the skillet in the oven and bake for 15-20 minutes, until the internal temperature reaches 140 degrees. Remove the loin and baste with the pan drippings. Cover with foil and rest for 5 minutes until internal temperature reaches 145 degrees.

Raspberry Sauce*:

1/4 c seedless raspberry jam

2 Tbs orange juice

2 Tbs white wine vinegar

Combine all ingredients in a saucepan, bring to a boil and cook for 2 to 3 minutes. The sauce will thicken as it cools. Slice your pork loin drizzle the raspberry sauce over the sliced loin.

*I have stuffed my pork loin with sauteed spinach; caramelized onions; stove-top stuffing. You choose!

**I usually double or triple the recipe for the raspberry sauce. It is delicious and I encourage my guests to pour it on!

I don't know about you, but I love the combination of raspberries and chocolate. So, the following cocktail is especially delicious with the pork loin recipe above:

Double Chocolate Martini:

- $2\frac{1}{2}$ oz half and half
- 1 ½ oz vodka
- 1 1/2 oz chocolate liqueur
- 1 ½ oz crème de cacao

Combine all ingredients over ice and stir until the outside of the container gets nice and cold. Strain into a martini glass. You can garnish the glass with chocolate syrup, you can rim the glass with grated chocolate, and/or add a maraschino cherry as a garnish. You can shake the drink, but the texture is going to be different because of the little bubbles and little pieces of ice you get.
