January 13th – Charlie will entertain us. He is the young guy with the two little boys.


January 20th is our annual yard sale with state baskets. This is the "big sale". We have 50/50, lunch and will raffle the baskets. Check the sign boards for the time.



A DAY TRIP TO DOWNTOWN ST. PETERSBURG

Busy Downtown St. Petersburg is home to major attractions like the Dali Museum, in a striking concrete-and-glass building, and the Museum of Fine Arts, plus the Mahaffey Theater for concerts and dance. Green spaces line the waterfront, with skyline views and festivals at Vinoy Park and a marina and picnic sites at Demens Landing Park. Steakhouses, seafood spots, and chic New American restaurants mix with happening bars and clubs for evening entertainment.

Every Saturday from 9am – 2pm October thru May, St. Pete's Saturday Morning Market opens with local farmers selling organic and sustainably raised fresh vegetables, fruits, and meats. There are also a great variety of artisan food vendors. (e.g. fresh seafood, baked goods, pastries, jams, chocolates, cheeses, salsas, chutneys, sauces, imported truffles, pickles, popsicles, spices, jerky, etc.). Hungry? Listen to live music while eating some of the styles of 'ready-to-eat' foods that are available (Greek, Italian, French, Belgian, German, Polish, British, Cuban, Mexican, Ecuadoran, Colombian, Thai, Ethiopian, Cajun, Vegetarian, and more). There are also a wide variety of juried craft vendors. <u>https://saturdaymorningmarket.com/</u>

The Dali (Salvador Dali Museum) celebrates the life and art of the influential and innovative artist. It is home to an unparalleled collection of over 2,400 Salvador Dalí works. The museum building was designed by architect Yann Weymouth and combines the rational with the fantastical. <u>https://thedali.org/</u>

The Museum of Fine Arts has an encyclopedic collection of art from around the globe and across the centuries, with almost 5,000 years of civilization represented in thousands of objects from antiquity to the present. The collection includes works by Georgia O'Keeffe, Claude Monet, Berthe Morisot, Auguste Rodin, Kehinde Wiley, Jacob Lawrence, and many others, as well as ancient Greek and Roman, Asian, African, Art of the Americas, and Native American art. The museum's photographic collection is one of the largest and most significant in the Southeast. The MFA has been repeatedly named the best art museum in the Tampa Bay area. https://mfastpete.org/

The St. Pete Pier, a landmark pleasure pier extending into Tampa Bay from downtown St. Petersburg. The current pier was opened in 2020, after having been several different structures over the years beginning in 1899. The Pier District hosts 26 acres of water sports, parks, restaurants & outdoor concerts. <u>https://stpetepier.org/</u>

The Morean Arts Center hosts the permanent Chihuly Collection. World famous Dale Chihuly is a pioneer of the studio glass movement, as is credited with transforming the methods of creating glass art and thereby leading the development of complex, multi-part glass sculptures and environmental art. <u>https://moreanartscenter.org/</u>

There are two launch sites adjacent to one another: Kennedy Space Center and Cape Canaveral. Cape Canaveral is an Air Force Base while Kennedy Space Center is NASA owned and operated.

COOKING CORNER

This month is all about comfort food and taking advantage of the availability of local produce. Hope you enjoy!

Chicken Broccoli Cauliflower Casserole

Ingredients:

- 4 cups broccoli florets 4 cups cauliflower florets
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- ¹/₂ teaspoon salt
- ¹/₂ teaspoon ground pepper
- 2 cups reduced-fat milk
- 2 ounces reduced-fat cream cheese at room temperature
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided
- 3 cups shredded or chopped cooked chicken

Directions:

Preheat over to 375 degrees. Grease an 8-inch square baking dish.

Steam the broccoli and cauliflower however you steam vegetables until almost tender. Transfer onto a baking sheet and pat dry.

Heat oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Add onion, cook stirring until it starts to soften, about 3 minutes. Add garlic stirring for about 1 minute. Sprinkle flour, salt and pepper; cook stirring for 1 minute. Increase heat to medium-high and whisk in milk and cream cheese. Cook whisking until the cream cheese is incorporated and the sauce has thickened, about 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from the heat and stir in ³/₄ cup of Parmesan cheese. Add the broccoli, cauliflower, and chicken, and stir to coat. Transfer to prepared baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining ¹/₄ cup of Parmesan cheese.

Bake until bubbling around the edges and lightly browned on top, about 20 minutes.

Gin is all the rage nowadays. It was originally created by a Dutch chemist, whose intention was to make an elixir that would cleanse the blood of folks suffering from kidney disease. England mass produced gin and made it affordable to the masses. It was nicknamed mother's ruin and was the downfall of many. The use of botanicals during distillation is what sets gin apart from vodka. Its dominant flavor and aroma are from juniper berries, which are required for the liquor to be called gin. Beyond that, some distillers add botanicals such as almond, anise, coriander, fennel, and citrus peels.

Tonic water is a carbonated drink known for the inclusion of quinine. Quinine is made from the bark of a tree native to Central America. Bitter quinine is valued for its antimalarial properties. It was combined with effervescent water in the late 18th century. Tonic water was a medical drink used as a preventative for malaria.

Classic Gin and Tonic

2 ounces gin 4 ounces tonic water Lime wheels

Fill a highball glass with ice and add the gin. Top with tonic water and gently stir. Garnish with lime wheels.


