

Some Awesome Things

Florida Gave The World

SPRING BREAK

Believe it or not, the ritual began in Florida. In 1938, college swimmers were invited to the state during their break from classes to swim in a new Olympic-sized pool in Fort Lauderdale. The innocent study break quickly turned into the beach bacchanal wreaking havoc all over the world every spring.

NASCAR

DECEMBER 14, 1947 – Bill France Sr. organizes a meeting at the Streamline Hotel in Daytona Beach, Florida, to discuss the future of stock car racing. NASCAR, the National Association for Stock Car Auto Racing, is conceived.

FEBRUARY 15, 1948 – NASCAR runs its first race in Daytona Beach at the beach road course. Red Byron wins in a Ford.

AIR CONDITIONING

In an attempt to cool the room for his yellow fever patients, in 1851 Dr. John Gorrie of Florida designed a machine that created ice using a compressor powered by horse, water, wind-driven sails or steam. Although he died penniless, his invention was the basis for this now commonplace convenience.

HOOTERS

The restaurant notorious for its bombshell servers was incorporated in Clearwater, Florida, in 1983. Now, there are Hooters locations in 44 U.S. states and 28 other countries.

KEY LIME PIE

The tangy dessert made with Key lime juice is a Florida staple, but the jury's still out on who concocted the thing. Botanist Jack Simons is often cited as having created the pie (named after the Key limes found in the Florida Keys), but the recipe was supposedly first mentioned by Key West millionaire William Curry. Whoever was responsible, Key Lime Pie is the official dessert of the state of Florida and a worldwide favorite.

FROZEN ORANGE JUICE CONCENTRATE

You may not want to buy concentrate, but the concoction was developed in 1948 at the University of Florida's Citrus Research and Education Center.



GATORADE

A team of scientists at the University of Florida, in an effort to create a beverage that replaced the lost carbohydrates and electrolytes in the university's Gator football players, a coach and the scientists made Gatorade.

HURRICANE SCALE

Miami engineer Herbert Saffir and meteorologist Robert Simpson developed a system to classify a hurricane's wind intensity in the 1970s. The 1–5 categorization is all thanks to them.

SUNSCREEN

While international pioneers had already conceived the formula for sunscreen, the first sunscreen lotion invented in the U.S. was crafted by Florida-based pharmacist Benjamin Green in 1944. The patent was sold to Coppertone.



Looking To The Sky

Remember Don McLean's song *Total Eclipse of the Sun*? It might be fun to sing it out on April 8 when parts of North America will be able to view the first total solar eclipse seen since 2017. A solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and the Earth, casting a shadow on the Earth. A total eclipse can be viewed along a diagonal path from Mexico, then into Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Missouri, Illinois, Kentucky, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New York, Vermont, New Hampshire and Maine. The Niagara region of Ontario will be the best place in Canada to see the total eclipse for the longest time. Montreal will also see a brief total eclipse.

Here in the Tampa Bay area we'll see about 60% of the eclipse starting about 1:35 p.m. with the midpoint at 2:55 p.m. Even though we won't get the total eclipse, we must still take precautions. Never look directly at the sun even if it is partially covered. Viewing any part of the sun with binoculars, a telescope, or through a camera lens without a special solar filter will result in severe eye injury! Remember those pinhole projector boxes we made as kids? Yep – still one of the best ways to view the eclipse.

Cooking Corner

Rhubarb is the vegetable of April!
It can be difficult to grow in Florida
because it doesn't do well in extreme

heat. But a diligent Florida gardener can grow rhubarb as an annual. A lot of us remember rhubarb that was grown by our grandparents when we were kids. Granddad and his joke – "here – take a bite of this red celery – it's great" Blah.



Rhubarb Crumble

Filling:

2 pounds rhubarb, cut into 1-inch pieces (about 6 cups)

1 ¼ cups white sugar

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 tsp vanilla extract

¼ tsp ground cardamom

Crumble Topping:

1 cup all-purpose flour

½ tsp salt

1 cup light brown sugar

8 tablespoons (1 stick) butter, cut into cubes

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees; grease a 9x13 baking dish
- 2. Prepare the filling: In a medium-sized bowl, mix together all the filing ingredients. Spoon into greased baking dish.
- 3. In a food processor, pulse together the flour, salt and brown sugar. Add the butter cubes and pulse until the pieces of butter are pea-sized. Or, mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl and cut the butter in with 2 knives or a pastry cutter. Spread the topping over the rhubarb mixture.
- 4. Bake for 35 to 45 minutes, until the filling is bubbling and the topping is lightly browned. Let cool for at least 30 minutes before serving.

Serve with vanilla ice cream or whipped topping.

Cocktail Of The Month

Gimlet

Ingredients:

2 ½ ounces gin ½ ounce fresh lime juice ½ ounce simple syrup

Directions:

Add all ingredients to a shaker with ice and shake until well-chilled. Strain into a chilled cocktail glass or a rocks glass filled with fresh ice. Garnish with lime wheel.


