PINECRAFT an amish community in sarasota

In the 1920s, Amish and Mennonite farmers were persuaded to come to the Sarasota area primarily to grow celery, a common Amish crop. When they arrived, they found the soil was not suitable for celery crops. However, the weather enticed them to stay, or at least visit on a regular basis. They created the community of Pinecraft, a small area of about 500 homes at the intersection of Beneva Road and Bahia Vista Street. You know you're in Pinecraft when you see folks dressed in traditional plain clothing and prayer coverings, often riding adult tricycles

with large baskets on the back (a replacement for horse-and-buggy transportation, which is not allowed on city streets). The Amish community is a testament to the preservation of tradition. Here, the Amish have found a place to continue their way of life while contributing to the local economy.

Amish furniture stores are very popular and carry handcrafted wooden pieces that are beautiful examples of Amish craftsmanship. In addition to furniture, Amish shops also showcase quilts, handmade toys, and artisanal home decor. Amish restaurants also carry a variety of handcrafted items. The Amish community has made its mark on the local culinary scene with a handful of restaurants that offer a taste of traditional Amish fare. These establishments focus on hearty, home-cooked meals made from scratch, using fresh and locally sourced ingredients. The restaurants are closed on Sundays.



Want To Try A Fun Outdoor Activity?

Explore some of the local u-pick farms! It can be a great day in the sunshine! Many of the farms offer not only seasonal fruits and flowers for you to hand pick, but also farm stores, festivals, tasting experiences, music and fun!

Strawberries: December – March Oranges and Citrus: Winter months, December – March Blueberries: March – May Peaches: Early spring Sunflowers: Spring and Fall

Here are some pointers to make you day more pleasurable:

- Bring plenty of water;
- Be prepared to get dirty ideally shoes should be closed-toe, old, or ones that are easily cleaned;
- Bring wet wipes, towels, paper towels great idea to avoid tracking dirt into your car;
- Pack sun protection;
- Bring the right containers some of the farms have bags and boxes to put your picked produce in, but it's a good idea to bring your own just in case. Keep in mind you're paying by weight, so lighter bags and baskets are a good idea.
- I would recommend calling, or checking the websites in advance of your planned trip to make sure their fields are open, and they have product available. The following are places I've been to or heard of. I'm sure there are other farms in the area.

Cooking Corner

In keeping with the theme of love in the month of February, and in celebration of National Dark Chocolate Day, I hope you enjoy the following homemade brownie recipe:

Ingredients:

1 ½ cups granulated sugar
¾ cup all-purpose flour
2/3 cup cocoa powder (sift if lumpy)
½ cup powdered sugar (sift if lumpy)
½ cup dark chocolate chips
¾ tsp sea salt
2 large eggs
½ cup canola oil or extra-virgin olive oil
2 Tablespoons water
½ tsp vanilla

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Lightly spray an 8x8 baking dish and line with parchment paper. In a medium bowl, combine dry ingredients. In a large bowl, whisk together the eggs, oil, water and vanilla. Sprinkle the dry ingredients over the wet, mix and stir until just combined. Pour batter into prepared pan. Bake for 40 to 48 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out with only a few crumbs attached. Cool completely before slicing.

Notes: It's better to take brownies out of the oven a little early, rather than leave them in too long! Also, the brownies will be super gooey when they come out of the oven. Let them cool at least 2 hours to allow them time to set-up.

COCKTAIL OF THE MONTH:

Chocolate-heavy brownies pair beautifully with red wine – particularly Merlot or Cabernet Sauvignon. As I've posted before – choosing a wine shouldn't be the cause of anxiety! Prices of wines range from bargain basement to ultra expensive. The rule of thumb is: if you like it, drink it!

Another great pairing with brownies is scotch whisky! I'm not much of a spirits drinker, but I have had this combination before and it is so good! Again, your taste buds, your choice of whiskey.
