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FOOD FOR THE SOUL

Submitted by Donna Womack PECAN PIE BARS (sold at Guide Dog Breakfast Fund Raiser

DIRECTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line a 9 x 13 pan with foil (grease the parts of the pan not covered in foil).

2. To make crust, beat butter and sugar together for 2 minutes. Then, mix in flour, salt and cinnamon. Dump into prepared pan, flatten out evenly and bake for 20 minutes.

3. Filling: In a small sauce pan melt butter over medium heat. Add brown sugar, honey, and cream. Let simmer for 1 minute, then stir in pecans and vanilla extract.

4. Pour filling onto crust and bake for another 20 minutes.

5. Remove from oven and let cool. Then left up on the overhanging foil to easily take the bars out of the pans and then cut.

Ingredients: CRUST: 1 C butter 2/3 C brown sugar 2 2/3 C flour ½ tsp. salt ¼ tsp cinnamon

PECAN TOPPING:

½ C butter
1 C brown sugar
1/3 C honey
2 Tbsp heavy cream
2 ½ C pecans, roughly chopped
2 tsp vanilla extract

Marina Jack Lunch Cruise



- Bring your place setting, water and/or coffee cup

GUIDELINES FOR A SUCCESSFUL POTLUCK

- Post Sign Up and help sheets 2 weeks prior to event (Potluck dinners – last Thurs. of month)

- Set tables the day before or morning of event

- Place napkins, salt & pepper shakers and misc silverware on serving tables

- Fill water pitchers (about 8) and put in refrigerator to chill before event

- Use large coffee pot (1 scoop per 10 cups) and turn on 1 hour prior to event

- Place Coffee pot, creamers, sugar, stirrers and water pitchers on table near dessert tables. Add empty basket for waste

- Use silicone pads/pot holders for hot food

- Set out dessert plates, also knives and servers on the dessert table

- Set out two lined trash cans

 Trash should be taken out by the maintenance area and placed in cans



Rentals/Maintenance Fees

Due dates are January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. Please include your unit number on your check. Storage users please include your space number of your check.

Renters

Renters please check in at the office with Marty when you come into the park.

Guest Book

Please remember to have your guests sign the Guest Book in the office. In an emergency the office must be able to account for all the people in the park to county or state officials. This is a very important requirement.

Garbage, Yard Waste, Recycling

Monday is garbage pickup. Wednesday is yard waste pickup. Thursday is garbage and recycling pickup. All are subject to adjustment for holidays.

Weeding

Remember it is the owner's responsibility to have the weeds removed from around your mobile home all year long. Please arrange to have someone do this in your absence.

Tree Trimming

Trees should be trimmed so the lower limbs are five (5) feet off the ground. At this height the grass mowers may move under them to cut the lawns.

Fruit Trees - Please take note as the varmints seem to be taking over!!!

Please remember to ask your friends and neighbors if you can have the fruit from their trees. They may have promised fruit to others and have designated a person to take care of the trees and fruit in their absence.

Keeping the fruit picked up from around the trees helps to keep insects, snakes and varmints away from the mobiles. There have been instances where varmints have gotten into mobiles. This is hazardous to say the least! Please arrange to have someone keep the fruit picked up in your absence.*

Lawn Mowing

Lawns will be mowed once a month December to April. Other months, will be once weekly, weather permitting.

Selling Items

Please do not sell items from your driveway. Take an ad to the office and ask for permission to place it on the bulletin board.

Feeling Safe

If you do not feel safe or you have a frightening experience at any time, call the police and then report the incident to the office.

Please do not flush anything but toilet paper in the commode to keep from clogging our sewers. Please note that "wipes" particularly seem to cause problems.

Washing RVs

Non-members may wash their RVs twice a year at \$20.00 each time.

Pet Walk

Pets are to be driven by car or bike or walked on the Erie Circle pet walk area. Please carry "doggie bags" to use in order to keep the area clean. Pets are not to be walked on other streets. Please keep your pets on a short chain in your lawn area.

Showers at the Pool

Florida law states that a shower must be taken by everyone before entering a swimming pool. We ask that everyone please abide by this law. This has become a bit of a problem of late with our many guests and visitors who may not understand the importance of this issue. When sun tan products, oils and creams, are not washed off (with soap) it creates hazardous conditions with the potential of folks slipping and falling, not to say what damage it causes to the filtration system in the pool. We appreciate your commitment to make this a primary matter to follow and stressing to your guests the importance of following the protocol.

Pool Lounge Chairs/Floating Devices

According to Florida law, lounge chairs must be four (4) feet from the pool. Please keep this in mind and do not move chairs closer to the pool as it could be a hazard. Only small children are permitted to use floating devices. Noodles may be used, but the type of noodle must be preapproved first. Please pass this information along when you have visitors.

Pool Umbrellas

In order to keep the pool umbrellas from being blown down or into the pool and broken, please close them when they are no longer being used.

Cigarette Butts

It has been noted that cigarette butts are being found littering the grounds in the park. We ask that smokers please dispose of their cigarette butts appropriately. Please respect our beautiful park and dispose of them properly.

Photo Copies

Residents may have up to five (5) photocopies of documents made in the office free of charge. Additional copies will be \$0.05 per copy. Up to two-page local faxes are free. More than two pages on local faxes will still be \$0.10 per page incoming, outgoing and for long distance faxes.

Water System

When the main water supply has to be shut down in an emergency or for maintenance, remember to turn off the electric breaker or shut off the main water valve in order to keep your hot water tank from burning out.

Park Management will notify proper personnel to shut off a zone and when to turn it back on. They will also notify affected residents when the water is turned off and when the water is turned back on.

Bicycle Safety

Lights on is a very good way to ride bicycles and tricycles after dark in the park. Some areas are not as well lighted in the park at night because of trees shading the area, so have a light on your bike when riding at night.

Need Air in Your Bicycle Tires?

There is an air hose at the clubhouse. Just ask :))

Speed Limit

The speed limit in the park is 15 MPH. Please observe this at all times.

NOTE of CAUTION: The yellow striped area at the outside the front gate of Chateau Village is NOT a turning lane, unfortunately. You can be ticketed if you are using it for one. Even though a "space" has been inserted on the road there, it is still not a turning lane.
