There are two prospectuses in this community. The P-1 (Revised) and the P-2.

The prospectus goes with the home. If you have purchased a home from a homeowner, they should have conveyed the prospectus to you. Or the Prospectus was given to you at closing. If you do not have a copy of the P-1 go to the office and request a P-1 Prospectus and Rule & Regulations.

If you have purchased a new manufactured home from ELS, you may have been given a P-2 prospectus. If you sell the home, again you should give the prospectus to your buyer.

## **Approved Vendors**

The Winds of St Armands requires licensed and insured vendors prior to performing work on the property. Below is a list of the vendors currently approved to perform work for the Winds of St Armands. If you have any work that needs to be done using one of these vendors, please understand that any transaction that you enter into with a vendor, merchant, or other party listed below is solely between you and that vendor, merchant or party.

If you have electrical and/or plumbing issues, please **call the office before calling a vendor.** If you are unable to reach the office and it is an emergency please call one of the vendors below. We pay the vendors listed based on their approval with our company.

Unfortunately, we do not take requests to have vendors approved. Other vendors not listed **for work other than electrical and plumbing**, may be used provided they have the required permits, licenses, and are bonded and insured according to property, state and local guidelines.

**NOTE:** Electrical and plumbing issues that would result in payment to a vendor from the Winds of St Armands must be one of the approved vendors below.

If it is after hours, please contact Professional Plumbing or Badger Bobs Services, which are ELS APPROVED VENDORS. They have a copy of our prospectus and are set up to bill the office if the repair is the community's responsibility.

#### **Community Reminders from Management**

Writing your lot number on the memo line of your rent payment check is very helpful, however, your address will suffice. We have an online resident portal that can be conveniently accessed at any time! Avoid writing a check every month and pay online at no charge with your checking account information, or for a small fee, you may use a credit card! For more information on how to set up your account, please contact the office to receive an instruction sheet.

If you remove the safety rope from the center of the pool to swim laps, please put it back when you are finished. If you find it off upon arrival at the pool, please put it back or let the office know and we'll be happy to assist. Having the rope properly placed in the pool is a county code, and more importantly, a safety issue.

The speed limit in the community is 15mph. Speeding in the community is a violation of the rules and regulations. At all times, please look out for your fellow residents taking a walk (with or without their pets) or taking a stroll in their golf cart. Please always abide by the speed limit for everyone's safety!

Trash, yard waste, and recycle is picked up on Mondays. If a holiday falls on a Monday, it will be picked up the next business day. Please place your trash at the end of your driveway no earlier than 5pm the day before. If you will not be home, please contact a neighbor to assist.

ALL guests must be registered with the office by the homeowner/residents. Homeowners are required to wear the orange wristbands when using the pool and amenities. Guests are required the wear the green wristbands, which are available at the office for a one-time fee of \$5.00 per band. No cash accepted.

Parking- please always refrain from parking on the grass. Temporary parking on the side of the road in front of your home is permitted if you are not blocking any surrounding neighbor's driveway. Streets must ALWAYS be accessible, especially emergency vehicles/first responders. Overnight parking in the street is NEVER allowed.

Community inspections are always on the radar. Please help keep your community looking great by staying attentive to your home's exterior. Remove clutter, power wash when needed, clean out gutters, keep flower beds weed free, keep bushes and smaller trees maintained. Do not store loose items around your home or in the grass. The mowers/edger's will only go so close to homes and items, such as flowerpots. We do not want any damage done to your belongings and the grass can be more maintained if these areas are free of random items placed around the home.

#### <u>Contact Information – All Homeowners</u>

It has come to our attention that many homeowners have still not updated us with current contact information. This makes it very difficult for us to reach you in the event of an emergency, or any other issue that may arise. Your contact information can be kept as "non-published" and not given out in the next community directory, or to the homeowners association if you so choose. Please stop by the office and pick up a contact update form. These can be emailed to you if you prefer. Just give us a call with your email address, and we will send it out ASAP. This is not just for homeowners that leave during the winter. This is for all homeowners in the community new and old. If your phone number has changed since you moved in, or you did not have it on the day you signed your paperwork, or your emergency contact has changed their number it is very important for us to get that information.

#### **Clubhouse/Pavilion Reservation Policy:**

If a homeowner wishes to reserve the clubhouse and/or pavilion for a private event the following is the policy that must be followed. A private event is any event not sponsored by the Home Owners Association that would include any person from outside the community, including entertainers; or any event that would exclude any resident in the community from coming to the event. This policy has been implemented to help us with scheduling events and to protect the homeowner against liability claims.

The homeowner will contact the management office to check availability of the clubhouse/pavilion. If the date is available they can reserve it with a \$100 deposit and a signed clubhouse/pavilion reservation agreement. The event is then added into the clubhouse/ pavilion calendar, which is kept in the management office. After the event, the clubhouse/pavilion will be checked for cleanliness and damage. If the clubhouse/pavilion is undamaged and has been properly cleaned, the \$100 deposit will be returned.

Seven (7) days prior to the event a certificate of insurance must be received in the management office or the event will be canceled. Insurance must be obtained if the homeowner is inviting and/or allowing any non-homeowners to the event. This includes entertainers.

The Good Neighbors sources available food from area grocers, restaurants and food businesses that are active participants in unsold food donation programs, seven days a week volunteers pickup donated food to provide to the community. They rely on the support from area businesses, personal donors and sponsor partners to keep their operation going strong. They often invite sponsors to set up a table and attend our food giveaway to receive operational support. While the sponsor may bring items or food to offer from their table, they do not purchase nor pay for any food the organization provide FREE to the community.

I [Judy] have set this program up for 2 months to see how we like this opportunity. After the two months we will revisit and make decisions on continuing this program. I have asked people to help at the Feb. one and we will need volunteers every month. We are expected to set up tables, set up food, hand out food and then clean up. I cannot do this alone it will take many volunteers.

# ICE (In Case of Emergency)

If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency? Hence this 'ICE' (In Case of Emergency) Campaign. The concept of 'ICE' is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As cell (mobile) phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during emergency under the name 'ICE' (In Case Of Emergency). The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scenes of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which number to call. He, therefore, thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, Emergency Service personnel and hospital Staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number you have stored as 'ICE'.

For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 and ICE3 etc. A great idea that will make a difference! Let's spread the concept of ICE by storing an ICE number in our Mobile phones today.
