We've been busy getting ready for your return. Some of the repair issues we've been working on have followed us into the new year. It is very difficult to secure contractors to do some of the work we need done because they are still working on Hurricane lan damage. UP THE CREEK

Gibsonton

Gibsonton (or Gibtown to locals) has long been the winter home of traveling circus and carnival workers. The location was close to Venice, Sarasota and Tampa for access to the Ringling Bros & Barney and Bailey Circus. Back before it became socially unacceptable, there were 'side shows' featuring The Bearded Lady, Inferno the Fire Eater, the Mule Faced Woman, and Lobster Boy among many others. Al Tomaini, the Giant (8'6") and his wife the Half Girl (2'6") built Giants Camp Lodge and Fish Camp just south of the Alafia River on US41. It is gone now, but a statue featuring his large boot has been erected on the site. Tomaini was also Police Chief and Fire Chief for many years, no doubt the tallest government official in the USA!



Once known as the strangest town in America, it had the only

Post Office in the country with a special low counter for 'little people'. The local fruit stand was run by the Hilton Siamese Twins. Local authorities applied special zoning laws that allowed the residents to keep almost anything in their yards, from elephants, lions, monkeys or other exotic animals to dismantled carnival rides and concession stands. The residents were bonded by the nomadic lifestyle of the travelling show.

Interestingly, Ringling Bros & Barnum and Baileys Circus recently announced they will be making a comeback, without the animals. Cirque du Soleil, a Canadian company, has very successfully produced dozens of circus shows around the world, all without animals.

Gibsonton is also home to the International Independent Showman's Association, a nonprofit worldwide organization representing more than 5000 people involved in the amusement industry. Their headquarters are located at 6915 Riverview Drive, Riverview Fl 33578. They conduct trade shows, bike fests and other charitable events, including Drag Queen Bingo. Pre-covid they also produced a Big Top old-fashioned circus, with the proceeds going to local charities. I keep checking with the Showman's Association to see if they are going to reopen the circus. At the time of this printing, they are having trouble procuring a big top tent, so no circus is scheduled.

In addition, they operate a 54,000 square foot museum that displays American Carnival and travelling show history. One of the first Ferris Wheels in the country is assembled and in operating condition inside the museum. Visitors can walk through antique wagons and trailers with ornate facades where show people lived or ran the day-to-day business of the carnival. Details at https://showmensmuseum.org/

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RECIPES



This is an easy and quick recipe that is pretty darn tasty on a January day.

Ground Beef Stroganoff

1 T Olive oil

1 lb. lean ground beef

½ medium onion, diced

1 lb. mushrooms, sliced

2 garlic cloves, minced

2 T all-purpose flour

1 c beef broth

1 c whipping cream

1/3 c sour cream

1 T Worcestershire sauce

Salt and pepper to taste

In a heavy, deep pan over medium-high, heat olive oil. Add ground beef and stir to break down beef into small pieces, until browned. Add onions and garlic. Sauté until the onion is golden brown.

Add sliced mushrooms and sauté for another 5 minutes.

Add flour and stir until fully incorporated. Be sure to breakdown any lumps that form.

Add broth, whipping cream, Worcestershire sauce, and salt and pepper. Bring to a simmer, turn heat to low and simmer for 5 minutes.

Remove beef mixture from heat and add sour cream. Stir to combine everything and add additional salt and pepper to taste.

Can be served over noodles, rice or potatoes.

Note: I sometimes add a tsp of yellow mustard to the sauce. I like the way it works with the Worcestershire sauce.

January 17 is National Hot Buttered Rum Day!! Try this recipe on one of our coldish January days!

Hot Buttered Rum

1 T butter, softened

1 tsp brown sugar

1 dash cinnamon

1 dash nutmeg

1 dash allspice

1 dash pure vanilla extract

2 oz dark rum

5 oz hot water

Optional cinnamon stick

Place the Butter, Sugar, and spices into the bottom of a heavy glass or mug. Mix well with a muddle. Pour in rum and top the glass with hot water. Stir well. Garnish with cinnamon stick if desired.
