

To Update Your "File for Life"

As we enter a new year, it is a good time to review your File for Life to see if it needs to be updated. You should check to see if any of your medications have changed or if you have had prescriptions added or discontinued. Correct any changes to your overall health condition. Add Doctors or specialists who might be new to your health program. Update your insurance information if necessary.

People come and go in your life, so now is a good time to see if your emergency contact names and phone numbers need to be modified. Be certain that you have all members of your household in the File, and that all of their information is current as well. The information you provide in the File could make the difference in a life threatening emergency.

If you don't have a "File for Life", your park office may have some, or you may contact the Sarasota County Fire Prevention office at 941-861-2290. You may also stop by the office at 5875 Hummingbird Avenue, Sarasota, FL 34241.

If you have the red "pocket" but need some new forms to fill out, you may tear off the one adjacent to this article, or you may pick one up at the Fire Dept. Administrative office mentioned above.

When you have completed the information card, why not photo copy it and put one in the glove box in your car or in your wallet or purse. That way it is with you if needed when you are away from home.

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9-1-1

Call if you can Text if you can't

The Sarasota County Sheriff's Office Emergency Operations Bureau announced today that the Public Safety Communications Center (PSC) will begin accepting text messages to 9-1-1.

While other counties have deployed text messaging solutions, the PSC is second in the state of Florida to launch the "Next Generation Text-to-911" services. The benefits of the service include quicker accessibility for citizen who are hard of hearing, deaf or speech-impaired. Text-to-911 will also help in situations when a crime is in progress, the caller is facing domestic abuse, or when the caller is injured and cannot speak. While the service offers a new level of convenience, emergency operations professionals warn the public of the challenges that come with evolving technology.

"While texting to 9-1-1 is available across Sarasota County, call takers have no way of pinpointing an exact location when a text message is received," said Emergency Operations Manager Kris Adams. "For that reason, it is imperative the user begins their message with a precise location and description of the emergency. With changes in technology and culture, written words and acronyms can take on completely different meanings. For example, while acronyms such as SMH might suggest 'shaking my head' to a citizen, our operators will receive that as 'Sarasota Memorial Hospital'. We can't stress the importance of clarity enough."

The Emergency Operations Bureau also reminds citizens that text messages sent to more than one person and test messages containing multimedia will not be accepted. If a text message contains a photo or video, or is sent outside of Sarasota County, the user will receive a bounce-back message stating, 'Please make a voice call to 911. There is no text service to 911 available at this time.' Citizens are urged to keep messages brief and concise without abbreviations or slang.

The following wireless carriers, compliant with rules set forth by the Federal Communications Commission, will offer text-to-911 services: Verizon Wireless, Sprint, AT&T and T-Mobile. Users must have a text or data plan to use the services and as with all text messages, messages sent to 9-1-1 may take longer to receive or may not be received at all. "Voice calls to 9-1-1 are still the best and fastest way to get help during an emergency," adds Emergency Operations Bureau Captain Jeff Slapp. "Technology can be temperamental and while we continue to adapt to these new services, we encourage citizens to call if you can, text if you can't."

Just this week, the Public Safety Communications Center received the Technology Leadership Award for a Large Communications Center from APCO International. Personnel will travel to Orlando this August where they will receive recognition for being a leader in public safety communications.

ICE - In Case Of Emergency

If we were to be involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone, but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored, but which one is the contact person in case of emergency? Hence this ICE (In case of Emergency) Campaign). The concept of "ICE" is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As cell (mobile) phones are carried by the majority of the population, all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during an emergency under the name "ICE" (In case of Emergency). The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scene of accidents, there were always mobile phones with patients, but they didn't know which number to call. He therefore, thought that it would be a good idea if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose. In an emergency situation, Emergency Service Personnel and hospital staff would be able to guickly contact the right person by simply dialing the number you have stored as "ICE'. For more than one contact name, simply enter ICE1, ICE2, and ICE3 etc.

A great idea that will make a difference! Let's spread the concept of ICE by storing an ICE number in our Mobile Phone today. Apparently this is a standard procedure of all paramedics follow at the scene of an accident when they come across your cell phone - ICE - In case of Emergency!)



The March 4, 2024 meeting of the Winds of St. Armands South HOA Board was called to order by President, Lori Cuson.

Lori reported she and Irv have completed the 2024 Board of Directors registration with Sunbiz.

Irv said the representative from Sarasota Fire Dept is scheduled to speak at tonights meeting, unless he gets called out on duty. If so, he has another person who can speak on the subject of fire extinguishers, Irv has the flyers for "File for Life" to pass out at tonight's meeting, Forms will be available for residents to take home, fill out and place in their refrigerators. This will have your personal medical information and be available if you ever have to have emergency personnel at your home. We will also publish this in the Windy News for those unable to be present at this meeting. There was some discussion on signs put in residents' yards and as this is a presidential election year. Bill was asked to check on the county ordinance concerning political yard signs and if there is a county ordinance on how long these signs can be on display.

JUST A REMINDER: The office no longer accepts checks or cash for your lot rent. On the portal you can enter your checking account information, a credit card (There will be a small fee), or Western Union payments.

POOL: All guests must be registered with the office by the homeowner/resident. Homeowners are required to wear the ORANGE wristbands when using the pool and amenities. Guests are required to wear the GREEN wristbands, which are available at the office for a one time fee of \$5.00 per band. NO CASH ACCEPTED.

Clubhouse/Pavilion Reservation Policy

If a homeowner wishes to reserve the clubhouse and/ or pavilion for a private event the following is the policy that must be followed. A private event not sponsored by the Homeowners Association that would include any person from outside the community, including entertainers; or any event that would exclude any resident in the community from coming to the event. This policy has been implemented to help us with scheduling events and to protect the homeowner against liability claims. The homeowner will contact the management office to check availability of the clubhouse/pavilion. If the date is available, they can reserve it with a \$100 deposit and a signed clubhouse/pavilion reservation agreement. The event is then added into the clubhouse/pavilion calendar, which is kept in the management office. After the event, the clubhouse/pavilion will be checked for cleanliness and damage. If the clubhouse/pavilion is undamaged and has been properly cleaned, the \$100 deposit will be returned. Seven (7) days prior to the event a certificate of insurance MUST be received in the management office, or the event will be canceled. Insurance must be obtained if the homeowner is inviting and/or allowing any non-homeowners to the event. This includes entertainers. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this policy, please feel free to contact the office at 941-355-6661.



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This was brought up at the Board Meeting in March. I felt it was important to reiterate the Pet Policy as per the Prospectus.

Pet Policy -

Guide to Carefree Living (Community Covenants)

N. Domestic pets must be licensed by the local governmental authority and be approved in writing by and registered with Management and pets must wear a rabies tag bearing the owner's name. A maximum of two (2) pets are allowed per household. Pets are permitted only with the permission of Management. Pets, when outside MUST be kept on a leash at all times. No pet may be left outside the home or in a screened room unattended. At no time may pets be walked on the streets in the Community (this includes cats). There is no designated "Pet Section" in this community.

- 1. BREED: A maximum of two (2) indoor, domestic pets are permitted. Pit Bulls, Rottweilers, Doberman Pinschers, Chows, Shar Peis, or other dogs commonly known for aggressive behavior are not allowed.
- 2. REGISTRATION: Only registered pets owned by Residents are allowed in the Community. Guests' pets are not permitted in the Community.



- 3. PET ENCLOSURES: No outdoor pet enclosures will be permitted in the Community. Pets, when outside of the Resident's home site, must be kept on a leash no longer than six(6) feet. No pet shall be left outside or tied unattended outside the home or left in a screened room unattended. Pets shall not be walked on the lawns of other Residents. Any animal left roaming the Community unattended may be removed by Management. If for any reason your pet becomes lost or runs away, please notify Management at once to assist in its prompt return.
- 4. NOISE: Noisy or unruly pets or those which cause legitimate complaints will not be allowed to remain in the Community.
- 5. COMMON AREAS: Pets will not be allowed in common areas or neighbor's home sights (this includes cats).
- 6. CLEAN-UP: Pet owners are solely responsible for the removal of all pet excrement or litter from the home site or from any place in the Community that the pet may be exercised by its owner. Such litter is not to be put in garbage cans unless enclosed within a container.
- 7. LIABILITY: Pet owners will be liable for any and all damages caused by their pet.
- 8. EXOTIC PETS: No exotic Pets are allowed.
- 9. SIGNS: No "Beware of Dog" signs are allowed.
- 10. MAXIMUM WEIGHT: The maximum weight of each pet shall be no more than 20 lbs.
- 11. CITATION: If the existence or activities of any pet results in a mobile home owner or the Park receiving a citation from the Sarasota County Health Department or from any other county or state or other governmental entity, it shall automatically be considered a violation of these RULES AND REGULATIONS.
- 12. DAMAGE: Residents must pay the damage caused by their pets or guests.

Pet Owners - We have lovely community. Please do your part to keep it clean and inviting for our residents and guests. Please remember that dogs and/or cats should always be on a leash no longer than 6 feet and under full control of the owner.

Pets must not be tied or left unattended in a fenced in area outside of your home. Always pick up after your pet and dispose of droppings properly. Pet litter belongs in a trash bag.
