DID YOU KNOW

I know we ran this article last season, but it bears repeating. That feeding bears, coyotes, foxes, raccoons, pelicans, alligators, crocodiles, sandhill cranes, and wild monkeys is illegal in the State of Florida?

We have many compassionate folks in the park who feed our local wildlife. While the animals love it, a quick and easy meal is not always in their best interests. For example:

Muscovy Ducks:

Have been illegally released in Florida primarily by private individuals for ornamental purposes or as pets. They are extremely prolific, and their local populations can increase dramatically in a short time. They are non-native and are considered an invasive species. They create problems through competition with native species, and damage to property. Its not healthy for them to become dependent on human food. They use the neighborhood as their bathroom, and their droppings can spread diseases to humans and to other wild waterfowl.

Feral Cats:

Can populate a city of their own in a very short time. Female cats can begin having litters at 5 months old and can have 2 to 3 litters of one to eight kittens per year. Cat food attracts skunks, raccoons, opossums, rats, and mice, who often spread illnesses among the cats, who in turn spread diseases to humans through their use of your yard, and the yards of your neighbors, as a litter box.

Raccoons:

Are dangerous to people and pets when cornered or protecting their young. They carry rabies. Diseases such as salmonella, leptospirosis, and raccoon roundworm are all carried in urine and fecal matter. They can cause significant damage by pulling apart vents, soffits, and roofing to get inside your home. Females can have up to 5 litters per year.

So please, for the animal's sake, and your relationship with your neighbors, don't feed the wildlife. They will be just fine on their own.

THE TAMPA RIVERWALK

The Tampa Riverwalk is a 2.6-mile path that runs along the waterfront of downtown Tampa. It connects various attractions, parks, restaurants, bars, hotels, and cultural landmarks, making it a vibrant and diverse destination for locals and visitors alike. Whether you want to explore the history, art, nature, or entertainment of Tampa, you can find something to suit your interests along the Riverwalk.

One of the main attractions of the Riverwalk is the Florida Aquarium, where you can see more than 20,000 sea creatures, touch stingrays, watch dolphin shows, and even swim with the fishes. The aquarium is located at the south end of the Riverwalk, near the Port Tampa Bay cruise terminal and the Channelside Bay Plaza. Also located here is Sparkman Wharf, a lively outdoor space that features a variety of food options from local chefs, a biergarten with craft beers, and a green space with live music and games.

The Tampa Bay History Center is a museum that showcases 12,000 years of Tampa Bay's heritage, from the Native Americans to the cigar industry. It is also close to Amalie Arena, where you can watch the Tampa Bay Lightning hockey team or catch a concert by a famous artist.

As you continue north along the Riverwalk, you will pass by several parks and public spaces that offer scenic views and recreational opportunities. You can rent a water bike, a stand-up paddleboard, or an e-boat at the Sail Pavilion and enjoy the river from a different perspective. You can also relax at the Curtis Hixon Waterfront Park, which hosts concerts, festivals, and other events throughout the year.

The Riverwalk also connects some of Tampa's most iconic cultural venues, such as the Straz Center for the Performing Arts, which hosts Broadway shows, opera, ballet, comedy, and more. You can also visit the Tampa Museum of Art, which displays modern and contemporary art as well as ancient Greek and Roman artifacts. Another popular spot at the North end of the Riverwalk is Armature Works, a restored trolley barn that houses a food hall with more than a dozen restaurants and bars.

Tampa Riverwalk is more than just a walkway; it is a cultural and recreational hub that reflects the diversity and vitality of Tampa Bay. RECIPES



Did you know that winter squash, which includes butternut squash, acorn squash and zucchini, is highly nutritious and is a quality source of vitamins, minerals and fiber. I have chosen acorn squash for my recipe this month. It is low in calories, high in vitamin C and loaded with antioxidants.

Stuffed Acorn Squash with Sausage

2 acorn squash (halved through from the stem to the base, remove seeds)

Salt and pepper

¹/₂ teaspoon olive oil

For the filing:

4 teaspoons olive oil (I use Extra Virgin)

1 pound ground Italian sausage (chicken, turkey or pork – your choice)

8 ounces mushrooms (you choose what kind – I use the small brown ones. Clean and stem, then finely chop) 1 small yellow onion chopped

1 medium sweet-crisp apple (cored and finely diced –

peel on or off as you desire)

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

¹⁄₄ teaspoon nutmeg

1/8 teaspoon allspice

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage (or thyme or a mix)

¹/₂ cup shredded parmesan cheese

Instructions:

Preheat your oven to 400 degrees. Arrange the acorn squash halves cut side up on a rimmed baking sheet. Brush with 1/2 teaspoon of olive oil. Bake for 40 minutes or until fork tender. When the squash is done set aside and turn the oven down to 375 degrees. Meanwhile, heat the remaining oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add the sausage. Brown the meat breaking into small pieces, for 3 minutes. Add the mushrooms, onion, apple, salt, pepper, nutmeg, allspice and minced garlic. Cook, stirring frequently, until the sausage is cooked through, the vegetables and apple are softened, and have given up their liquid, and the liquid has cooked off, about 8 minutes. When the squash is cool enough to handle, scoop out the flesh, leaving a wall about 1/4 inch thick. Add the scooped squash to the sausage mixture. Stir in the herbs and ¼ cup of parmesan cheese. Taste and adjust salt and pepper as desired. Mound the filling in the squash shells equally. Sprinkle the remaining parmesan cheese over the top. Return stuffed squash to the oven and bake until cheese is melted and the filling is hot, about 15 minutes. Sprinkle with additional herbs as desired. Serve hot.

Apple Cider Sangria

This would be a yummy accompaniment to the stuffed squash:

- 1 Granny Smith apple, sliced
- 1 Honeycrisp apple, sliced
- 1 lemon, sliced
- 1 orange, sliced
- 2 cups apple cider
- 1 (12 oz.) can ginger beer
- 1 (750 ml.) bottle of white wine

Fill a large pitcher with the sliced fruit, then add the apple cider, ginger beer and wine. Chill. Stir the mixture before serving.
