



FUN FACTS ABOUT AMERICA'S THANKSGIVING

The Pilgrims landed in New England on November 11, 1620. The first Thanksgiving is thought to have been celebrated in 1621.

The menu at this first "thanksgiving" did not include turkey. Venison, duck, goose, oysters, lobster, eel, and fish were likely served, alongside pumpkins and cranberries.

Indigenous people had many uses for cranberries. Not only did they eat cranberries, they also used cranberries to heal wounds and dye fabrics.

The first national Thanksgiving was declared by President George Washington and was celebrated on Nov. 26, 1789. In his "Thanksgiving Proclamation of 1789" Washington defines the day as a pious time to thank God for, amongst other things, protecting Americans and helping them achieve independence.

Americans consume 704 million pounds of turkey on Thanksgiving Day.

The average person consumes about 4,500 calories on Thanksgiving Day.

Butterball's Turkey Talk Line answers more than 100,000 turkey-cooking questions each November and December.

In 1953, the original TV dinner was created by Swanson after the company miscalculated it's Thanksgiving turkey sales, leaving the company with some 260 tons leftover. A salesman suggested packaging the excess product into trays—along with some traditional sides—and selling them to consumers as TV dinners. He received a bonus of \$1000 for his idea.

The tradition of football on Thanksgiving began in 1876 with a game between Yale and Princeton. The first NFL games were played on Thanksgiving in 1920.


Turkeys are named after the country. Europeans received guinea fowl, which resemble turkeys, from Turkish traders and called them turkey-hens or turkey-cocks. When settlers from the Americas began sending what we call turkeys back to their European counterparts, the latter began referring to them by the same name. Thus, we have turkeys!

For some, Thanksgiving dinner isn't complete until the bird's wishbone is snapped, bestowing luck on the bearer of the bigger piece. This custom is thousands of years old. Ancient Etruscans used chickens to help them predict the future. After the chickens died, the Etruscans would dry their wishbones in the sun and keep them as good luck charms.

We have many compassionate folks in the park who feed our local wildlife. While the animals love it, a quick and easy meal is not always in their best interests. For example:



Muscovy Ducks:

Have been illegally released in Florida primarily by private individuals for ornamental purposes or ast pets. They are extremely prolific, and their local populations can increase dramatically in a short time. They are non-native and are considered an invasive species. They create problems through competition with native species, and damage to property. Its not healthy for them to become dependent on human food. They use the neighborhood as their bathroom, and their droppings can spread diseases to humans and to other wild waterfowl.




Feral Cats:

Can populate a city of their own in a very short time. Female cats can begin having litters at 5 months old and can have 2 to 3 litters of one to eight kittens per year. Cat food attracts skunks, raccoons, opossums, rats, and mice, who often spread illnesses among the cats, who in turn spread diseases to humans through their use of your yard, and the yards of your neighbors, as a litter box.

So please, for the animal's sake, and your relationship with your neighbors, don't feed the wildlife. They will be just fine on their own.

TIP OF THE MONTH Clean Your Eyeglasses With Soap

I wear eyeglasses and I am constantly cleaning them with either lens wipes, (which I buy by the carton at Sam's Club or Walmart), or that special lens cleaner only available from the optical shop. When either of these are not available, I'll resort to hot breath and the bottom of my tee-shirt, which sometimes only makes matters worse. Paper towels or tissues will have the same effect and may scratch the lenses too. I recently read an article that has been very helpful.

Cleaning Your Glasses with Soap!

Wash your hands to get rid of anything grimy or germy. Rinse your glasses in warm water (not too hot not too cold). Add a drop of plain, gentle dish soap to the lenses.

Smear the soap around on both sides of the lenses and the earpieces.

If need be, use a cotton swab to clean out dirt around the edges of the lenses where they meet the frames.

Rinse off the soap.

Dry everything with a lint-free or microfiber cloth.

Wash your microfiber or lint-free cloth regularly. It holds the oils from your hands, so if you don't wash it, it will just smudge the lenses you've just cleaned.

Don't use glass cleaner or any other chemicals as they can remove any coatings that you've paid to have on your lenses. Soap is all you need.





RECIPES



Fall is here, and it's sports season! Here are a couple of recipes to enjoy while you watch your favorite football, hockey, or playoff baseball game:

Jalapeno Poppers

10 large jalapenos

8 oz cream cheese, softened

½ tsp garlic powder

½ tsp salt

1/4 tsp pepper

1 ½ cup shredded cheddar cheese

½ pound bacon, cooked and crumbled

1/4 cup green onions, sliced

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Wearing gloves, slice each jalapeno in half lengthwise and use a spoon to remove the seeds and veins. That's where most of the heat is.

In a medium bowl, combine the cream cheese, garlic powder, salt, pepper, shredded cheese, crumbled bacon and green onions.

Spoon the mixture evenly in the jalapenos and place on a baking sheet. Bake for 20 minutes or until the jalapenos are tender.

Apple Cider Mimosas

These are so yum!!! Rimming the glass with the cinnamon sugar really adds a nice flavor!

- 1 bottle champagne
- 1 cup apple cider
- 2 Tbsp sugar
- 1 Tbsp cinnamon

On a small plate combine the sugar and cinnamon. Dip your champagne or other glass in water to wet the rim, then dip into the cinnamon sugar. Fill each glass ¼ full with apple cider, then top off with champagne.
