American Flag

The American flag for the month of April 2024 is being flown in memory of Robert R. Holloway. Bob enlisted in the Army in 1959. After being assigned to the Army Corp of Engineers, he spent much of his active duty in Greenland within the Arctic Circle, where the

Army was constructing a nuclear base under the polar icecap. This project became known as Camp Century and was featured as a major article in the 1962 issue of National Geographic magazine. After discharge he returned to Indiana and spent 30 years working for the publishing company, RR Donnelley. In retirement, Bob and his wife, Esther, spent 20 years as snowbirds in Harbor Isles. Bob was an antique car enthusiast and restored many cars during his lifetime. He enjoyed many activities in Harbor Isles, participating in Bocce, Carvers Club, Boat Club, and the Veterans Club. Bob passed away in March 2021, preceded by his wife, Esther in 2015. His son, Steven, currently lives in Harbor Isles.

The American Flag at the front entrance is proudly maintained by the Harbor Isles Vet's Club. All resident Veterans are urged to join our club and be part of the activities that we enjoy. Many of our residents fly their own flags and we Veterans encourage that they be lit at night or be taken down. 
